

Call for Papers

To celebrate our 50th anniversary we will be holding a one-day conference in autumn 2018 to review archaeology in London over the past five decades. We are seeking ideas and contributions on a range of topics and themes. We envisage 12 to 14 papers, beginning by considering how activity and research over these decades has changed perceptions of archaeology, and then reviewing changes in approach and practicalities, and the impact these have had. Some of the ideas that might fit in this framework could include

landscape, industrial, community, environmental, and standing building archaeology;
specialist finds areas such as pottery, accessioned finds and building material;
archaeological strategy, and commercial and legal frameworks;
voluntary and professional archaeology;
heritage, history and archaeology;
site management, recording, health and safety, and technical developments;
conservation, archiving, and presentation of archaeology;
archaeology and the press; personalities shaping the half century.
